

Ten Stages of Grief

(Not necessarily in the order of their occurrence)

SHOCK

Overwhelming sorrow causes a temporary state of anesthesia, which should last only a short time.

EXPRESS EMOTION Uncontrollable urge to express grief; crying.

FEEL DEPRESSED AND VERY LONELY

Feelings of utter depression and isolation, that neither God nor anyone else cares, that no one has grieved like this.

MAY BECOME PANICKY

Thinks of nothing but the loss, which hinders effectiveness in everything. Wonder so if he is losing his mind and grip on life.

FILLED WITH ANGER AND RESENTMENT

Critical of everything and blames anything connected with the loss. Why did God do this? How could He be a loving God?

HOPE GRADUALLY COMES THROUGH

A little glimpse of hope comes in one experience or another.

...grieve like the rest of men, who have no hope.

PHYSICAL SYMPTOMS OF DISTRESS

Unresolved grief. Has not worked through central problems related to loss. Ha stopped at a place of feeling guilt and hostility.

STRUGGLE TO AFFIRM REALITY

"Never old selves again." Become "different" people; either stronger or weaker, either healthier or sicker in spirit.

RESISTING RETURN TO NORMAL

The sorrow must be kept alive. Do not let things go back to the way they were before.

FEEL A SENSE OF GUILT ABOUT THE LOSS

Normal guilt or neurotic guilt. Offenses occur because of things blown out of proportion.
